

Proceedings of the Faculty Senate
Meeting of Monday May 3, 1954

The meeting of the Faculty Senate convened in regular session at 3:40 P.M. on Monday, May 3, 1954, in Room 101 of the Law Building. Thirty-four members were present with Dr. Nugent presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of April 5, 1954, as previously distributed to members of the Senate, were approved.

Catalog changes, Report re: Several changes in catalog listings were approved by the Senate. The amended proposal from the College of Agriculture for deletion of plane geometry as requirement for admission to regular freshman standing was approved with the proviso that Plan A is highly recommended for all students and that geometry as an entrance unit will be required for students who plan to major in Agricultural Engineering or Agricultural Chemistry and Soils. Also Math. 70 was deleted as a general requirement and Math. 20 or 22 substituted therefor.

Another item of interest involves the approval of a new program of graduate study in the department of Electrical Engineering to meet a demand from such sources as the Motorola Research Laboratory of Phoenix, Public and Private Power companies, Hughes Aircraft Company of Tucson, and the recently established research facilities at Fort Huachuca.

The above changes, together with those which have been approved at earlier meetings of the Senate, will be published this summer in a supplement to the biennial catalogue.

Registration Committee Report, consideration of: The following action was taken on the report of the Committee to Study Registration Policies and Procedures:

First Semester Registration

1. Regular registration scheduled for a two-day period. Approved.
2. Provision to allow upper-division and graduate students to register during Freshman Week with the understanding that such registrations are acceptable only during a three-hour period 9 to 12 each morning. Not Approved.
3. Enrollments on the regular days of registration to be controlled by an hourly quota system, based on a lottery administered by the student body. Approved.
4. Medical examinations for new students to be distributed throughout Freshman Week by appointment. Approved.
5. Student identification photographs for all students distributed throughout Freshman Week by appointment. Approved.

Action on recommendations for Second Semester registration was deferred until the fall following a study of the first semester quota system registration.

Absences policy re, report on: Consideration of this report was tabled until a later meeting.
