

TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE FACULTY:

Procedure of the Faculty Senate  
Monday, May 3, 1948

STUDENT BODY ASSEMBLIES: The Senate provided that the student body may schedule not more than two assemblies during regular class hours each semester during the year 1948-49, with the provision that one of the first semester assemblies must be in observance of Mother and Dad's Day, and one of the second semester assemblies in observance of the annual Women's Day. Classes missed will not be made up.

CHEATING, REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON: The Senate adopted the following recommendation submitted by the committee appointed to study the problem of cheating. The committee has not yet submitted a final report.

"This recommendation is two-fold. First, it is recommended that the administrative officers of the University, during Freshman Week or on any other appropriate occasion, attempt to impress the students with the importance of scholastic honesty and acquaint them with the University policy for dealing with offenders.

Second, it is recommended that the academic deans each semester acquaint their new staff members, if any, with the University policy for dealing with cases of scholastic dishonesty. (Note: The Chairman of the University Committee on Student Examinations and Reports will provide the deans with sufficient copies of the statement of this policy for this purpose.)"


STUDENT UNION BUILDING, REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SITE FOR: The Senate voted to accept the final report of the committee and to recommend to the Board of Regents that the present site of the Commons Building and the adjacent vacant lot be selected for the location of the proposed Student Memorial Building.

AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION, RECOMMENDATION FOR: The Senate voted to revise the proposed amendment to the constitution as adopted at its meeting of April twenty-seventh to provide that the Registrar be made a member of the Senate and that the number of members at large in the Senate be increased from twelve to fifteen.

This proposed amendment and a petition submitted to the President requesting a similar change cannot be considered at the May twenty-second meeting of the General Faculty because of the twenty-day limitation on notices regarding changes in the constitution.

ADVISORY COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP: The Senate by formal vote commended the Advisory Council for the appointment of the Faculty Chairman as a member of the Council.

OUTSIDE WORK, REPORT ON POLICY RE: The Senate reviewed a statement setting forth the consensus of the Committee of Eleven on the question of outside work. The committee was asked to review and modify its findings in the light of official policy in effect at present.
