HONORARY DEGREES, RECOMMENDATIONS RE: The Senate voted to recommend the award of four honorary degrees at the Commencement exercises in May 1959. The recommendations next are to be considered by the General Faculty. Announcement of these will be made upon approval by the Board of Regents.

DESIGNATION OF PASSING GRADES FOR CERTAIN GRADUATE COURSES, ADJUSTMENT IN: The Senate adjusted its earlier action establishing the grades of Satisfactory and Superior as the only passing grades available in certain graduate courses, as follow: 299 - Special Problems (when taken for Graduate credit); 399 - Seminar (when taken for Graduate credit); 400 - Research; 405 - Internship; 410 - Thesis; and 420 - Dissertation.

The Senate voted that the new grades be "Pass" (P), and "Superior" (S), rather than "Satisfactory" and "Superior".

75TH ANNIVERSARY OBSERVANCE, REFERENCE TO: President Harvill reminded the Senate members that the 75th Anniversary of the founding of the University would be observed from July 1, 1959 to December 31, 1960. He informed the Senators that special committees now arranging the anniversary observance program will be announcing their plans shortly. Special mention was made of the new University stationery which will carry on the letterhead reference to the 75th Anniversary and which will be used by all University offices for all correspondence beginning July 1, 1959.
