Delinquent Scholarship Report Procedures, further consideration of report on:
The Senate considered further the report submitted by Dr. Merritt for a special committee appointed to study Delinquent Scholarship Report Procedures, with action as follows:

- A. President Harvill confirmed the action of the Senate at its last meeting which removes the restriction on the establishment of credit made during a period of disqualification. This resulted from the Senate denial of a recommendation that the present policy be continued.
- B. The committee recommended that in computing the grade average required for graduation the present practice of disregarding failures made in the first two years when the course is repeated for credit be discontinued. The Senate did not adopt the recommendation, and the present policy continues.
- C. The Senate adopted a provision which allows a student to transfer from another institution the credit and grade in one semester course in adjustment of the grade average required for graduation when the course transferred (elective) is approved by the Dean of the college concerned.
- D. The Senate adopted a provision which allows the student to offer one semester elective course by correspondence study with the University in adjustment of the grade requirement for graduation.
- E. The Senate adopted a provision which enables the Dean of the college concerned to remove, at his discretion, the scholarship probation status awarded because of failures in summer session.
- F. The Senate placed on the agenda of its first fall meeting the proposal of Dr. Merritt's committee that standards based upon grade averages be used as a basis for determining probation status instead of the present percentage requirement.

Arizona College Association, election of Councilman: The Senate elected Dr. William J. Pistor as a Councilman in the Arizona College Association to fill the vacancy occasioned by the election of Dr. Walter S. Phillips to the office of Vice President of the Association.

Reports: President Harvill reported that the Board of Regents had approved his recommendation that students of the University who are sons or daughters of faculty members be permitted to register at a special incidental registration fee of \$5.00 plus such special fees as laboratory course, library, Student Union, and activity fees. This provision does not, however, apply to sons and daughters of staff members.

The names selected for the two new men's dormitories are Huachuca Hall and Kaibab Hall.
