
CATALOGUE MATERIAL, APPROVAL OF: Changes and additions in the biennial announcement as previously reported to the Senate and reviewed at this meeting were accepted.

REPORTS OF DISHONEST SCHOLASTIC WORK, INTERPRETATION OF POLICY RE: A report was accepted from the Special Committee appointed to interpret the action of the Senate in connection with adoption of recommendations of the Committee on Dishonest Scholastic Work affecting student records in the office of the Registrar. The report confirmed the practice of withholding from the record, upon recommendation of the Committee on Dishonest Scholastic Work, any reference to "By administrative action", or "Upon recommendation of the Committee on Dishonest Scholastic Work." It also confirmed, however, the practice of listing in all cases the nature of the action taken.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES, COMMITTEE TO STUDY: President Harvill announced the appointment of a committee to study the question of rearranging the schedule of classes. The committee includes Professor Martin Thornburg, Professor A. A. Andersen, and Registrar Leshner as Chairman.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS, ADOPTION OF REVISED STANDARD RE: The Senate adjusted the present grade average requirement for graduation by adopting a committee report as follows: "The graduation requirement is 3.2000. Failures in the freshman year and through the last semester in which the student has sophomore standing may be removed by repetition of the course, and in those cases only the credit and grade value of all repetitions will be used in calculating the average."

It was understood in connection with the above that this requirement for graduation applies in all colleges except the College of Law which retains the 3.0000 requirement, and further that it does not affect the average required for admission to the College of Law, College of Education, or the College of Pharmacy, which is retained as 3.0000.
