

PROCEEDINGS OF THE FACULTY SENATE

Monday, December 3, 1951

TIE VOTES, BY-LAWS COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION RE: The By-Laws Committee was asked to consider further the plan of resolving tie votes in elections for membership in the Senate, Committee of Eleven and for Faculty Chairman. This request was submitted in consideration of suggestions made by the Senate.

EXCHANGE PROFESSORSHIPS, CONSIDERATION OF: At the request of the Committee of Eleven, President Harvill indicated that he would appoint a special committee to study the matter of establishing exchange professorships between the University of Arizona and other colleges and universities in the United States.

ELECTIONS: It was announced that elections to membership in the Senate had been completed and that new members will meet with the Senate on the first Monday in January, 1952. Elections of members of the Committee of Eleven and of the Faculty Chairman are in process.

RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE, ANNOUNCEMENT RE: The Senate calls the attention of all members of the faculty to the Red Cross Blood Drive which will be held in the Basement of the Women's Building on Friday, December 7, between the hours of 10 A.M. and 4 P.M., and invites them to announce the drive to their students. A special notice to the faculty was authorized.

FACULTY DINING ROOM, USE OF: A report was received indicating that some criticism had been voiced regarding the administration of facilities in the Student Union Building allocated to the faculty and staff. Reference was made particularly to the faculty dining room. It was desired to reserve these facilities exclusively for members of the faculty and staff if possible, and designate them as being so reserved. President Harvill pointed out that there are certain practical problems related to the cost of operating the facilities but that this matter would be given very careful consideration. The Senate desires that all members of the faculty and staff be aware of the availability of both the faculty dining room and the faculty lounge, and urges that these facilities be used to the utmost. The opinion was expressed that the quality of the food and the service rendered is such as to make the facilities very attractive.
