New member: Members of the Senate welcomed Dr. Matthew M. R. Schneck, Head of the Department of Philosophy and Psychology, who returns to the Senate to fill the unexpired term of Dr. A. Laurence Muir as representative from the College of Liberal Arts.


New course: The following new extension division course was approved by the Senate: Education 259-E, The Junior College - 3 credits.

Second semester registration, plan re: Although the Senate Committee on Registration last spring recommended some adjustments in the plan of registration for the second semester, particularly in connection with the issuance of registration materials and the adjustments of the advisory program, the Senate voted to continue the plan as administered in September. The quota system of registration will be followed, with an adjustment in the groups assigned to the hours of registration, and the advisory program will be limited to the regular office hours of the faculty members. Registration materials will be issued at the time of registration, but the schedule of hours will be made available early in January.

Faculty membership and the voting privilege: The Senate reviewed a report of the committee appointed to discuss with the President the listing of members of the faculty who have the voting privilege. The general policies in this connection were reviewed and suggestions made for revision of the present listing, which in general follows that of the list of administrative, teaching and research members of the faculty as published in the current catalogue. Disposition of the matter was tabled until the next meeting of the Senate.

Honorary degrees, policy re award of: The Senate received a report of a survey made by the University of Texas regarding institutional practice in connection with the award of honorary degrees. The members were asked to study this report in preparation for formal action on this matter at a future meeting.

A.A.U.P. Committee on Department Heads, report of: The Senate received copies of a report on administrative relationships within departmental organizations prepared by an A.A.U.P. committee and forwarded to the Committee of Eleven. Action on this matter was postponed pending a study of the report by members of the Senate.
