

Proceedings of the Faculty Senate

Meeting of Monday

January 7, 1957

Welcome of new members: Dr. Nugent, on behalf of President Harvill, who was attending the inaugural of Governor McFarland in Phoenix, expressed pleasure in welcoming the new members, including Senators Pistor, Mead, Marcoux, Merritt, Howard, Thomas Martin, Enke, Casaday, Hudson, Vavich, Kemmerer, Gegenheimer, Lynn, Paylore and Rhodes. Dr. Rhodes returns as Chairman of the Faculty.

Senate membership, election to: The Senate elected Dr. George W. Barr to membership to fill the vacancy occasioned by the election of Dr. Herbert D. Rhodes to the post of Chairman of the Faculty.

Committees, report of: Professor H. A. Marcoux, Chairman of the special committee appointed to study a proposal to establish a tri-mester system indicated that a report of his committee should be ready in four or five weeks.

Dr. Klonda Lynn, Chairman of the special committee appointed to study recommendation regarding Principles and Procedures in the Processing of Petitions for Adjustments in Degree Requirements indicated that the committee was now at work and it was expected a report would be ready for the Senate at its next meeting.

Elections, proposed adjustments in: Mention was made of the proposal submitted by Dr. Haury at the Senate's last meeting, that the method of faculty elections be reviewed with the thought that the nominee might indicate whether or not he was interested in standing for election. The proposal was referred by the chair to the Committee on By-laws.

Delinquent reports, proposal re: The Senate asked the President to appoint a committee to study a report on a proposal that a scholarship report be published earlier in the semester, possibly at the end of the fifth or sixth week, and that a grade of "W" rather than grade of "5" be awarded in connection with adjustments made as result of the scholarship report.
