

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE FACULTY SENATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA
Monday, May 6, 1963 Room 111, BPA Building

Law 121s - Land Use Controls (2); Law 153s - Restitution (2);


Change: Law 180s, change course title from "Patent, Trademark and Copyright" to "Copyright and Unfair Competition."

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING PRESIDENT HARVILL IN EFFORTS TO GAIN APPROVAL OF CAPITAL OUTLAY REQUEST: On a motion by Dr. Kurtz, seconded by Dr. Gegenheimer, the Senate unanimously adopted a motion commending President Harvill for his efforts to obtain legislative approval for the capital outlay request to the 1963 Legislature for buildings and land acquisition and wishing him the best of success in this endeavor.

In discussing this subject it was pointed out by Dr. Patrick and others that while sufficient statistical data had been compiled justifying the University's urgent need for additional space, other types of information might be helpful to the President. For instance, if members of the Faculty could provide the President with impressive examples of how crowding hampers instruction and research, or information concerning staff members who have left the University because they did not have adequate space in which to work, such information could be helpful to him.
