ASUA NOMINATIONS FOR STUDENT SENATE, 1986-87

ASUA has submitted two nominations for faculty representatives to the Student Senate for ratification by the Faculty Senate at its meeting on September 8, 1986. The nominees are:

Dr. Kent Kloeping, Director, Disabled Student Services, and Adjunct Professor, Rehabilitation. Dr. Kloeping has been a member of the University of Arizona faculty since 1970. He earned his doctorate in Rehabilitation Counseling; as an Assistant Professor in the Rehabilitation Center from 1975-81, he served as an academic advisor to undergraduate, masters, and doctoral students. He continues to interact with students on a daily basis in his present position. A recipient of many awards for his work with physically handicapped students, he has also obtained a number of grants to provide special services and physical education opportunities for disabled students. Author/co-author of many publications and unpublished papers, Dr. Kloeping is vitally interested in student-related issues.

Dr. Naomi Reich, Professor, Clothing and Textiles, School of Family and Consumer Resources, and Research Scientist, Human Environment and Design. Dr. Reich earned her doctorate in Man Environment Relations at Pennsylvania State University. She has been a member of the University of Arizona faculty since 1974, and chaired the Division of Clothing, Textiles and Interior Design from 1977 to 1984. Among her major research fields are: development, implementation, and testing of innovative instructional systems for varied audiences; and, for the last decade, the area of clothing for the handicapped and elderly. Dr. Reich has written extensively in her field, has contributed heavily to College and Division committees, and has provided leadership as President, Chair, or other officer in many professional societies. Dr. Reich serves as a major advisor for both undergraduate and graduate students.
