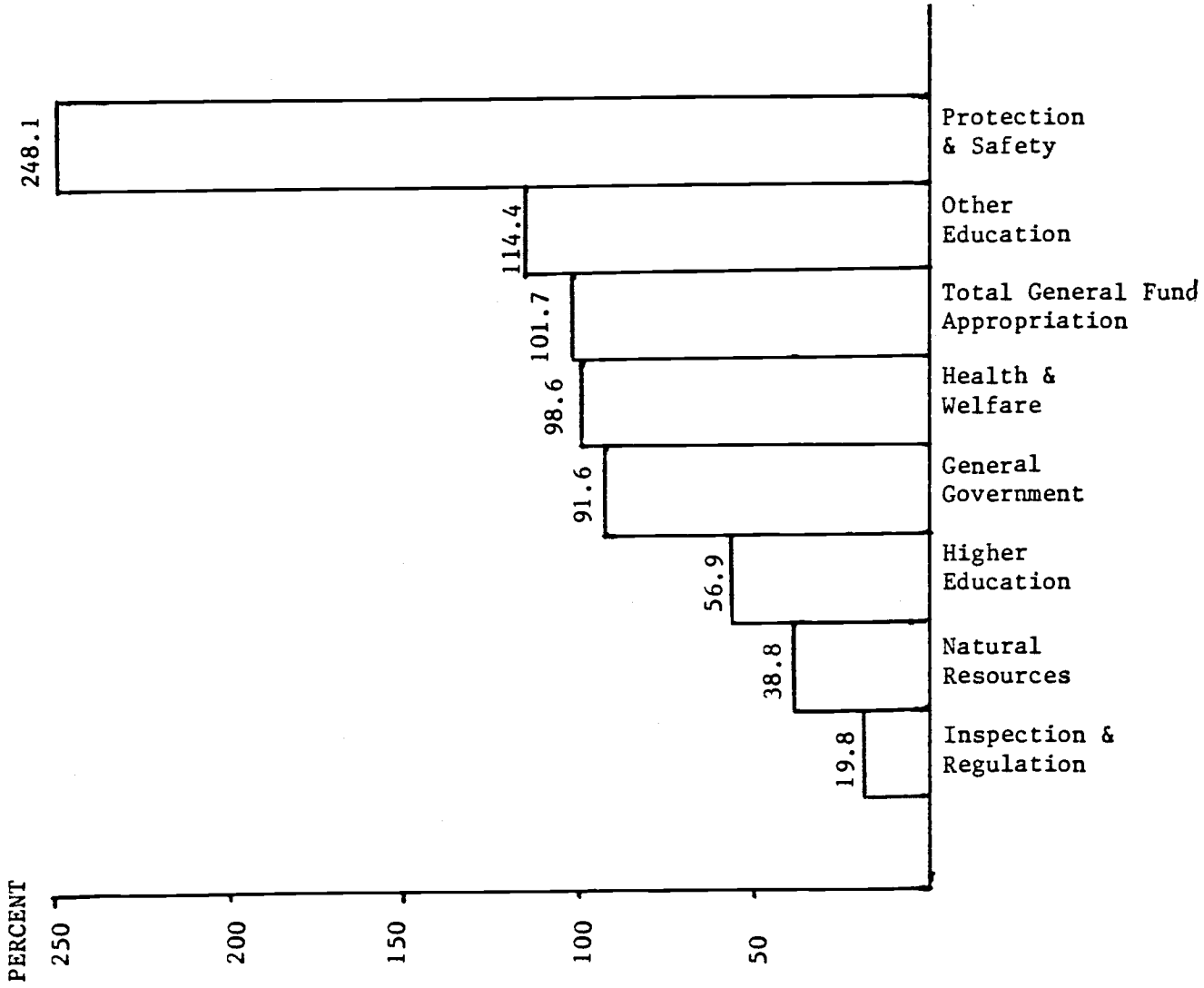

Centennial Year: Honorary Degrees

The Centennial Committee has proposed that honorary degrees be conferred at six major events during 1985 as part of the University's celebrations, as follows:

Jan '85 Opening convocation
 Mar '85 Founders' Day
 May '85 Spring Commencement
 Oct '85 UNESCO Arid Lands Conference
 Nov '85 Homecoming
 Dec '85 Winter Commencement

The normal arrangements for nominating and approving honorary degree recipients will not be suitable for 1985. The Opening Convocation and the UNESCO Conference are unusual in that the candidates will be scientific, literary, artistic, and international political figures nominated by the Centennial Committee with close cooperation with the Colleges. In order to minimize the discussions required by the Faculty Senate, the General Faculty and the Board of Regents, nominations for all six events will be presented in two groups developed according to the following schedule. Since this process will impinge on the nomination process for honorary degrees to be conferred at Spring Commencement 1986, that schedule is included here also for the sake of completeness.
