ORGANIZATION AND PLANNING: ADULT:

The Agent enjoyed and appreciated the cooperation given in the County Fair. Mrs. Geneva Greer, as Chairman of the Women's Department, spent one day with the Agent, previous to the Fair, in visiting homes with the Agent in St. Johns for stimulating effort in making entries. The Agent spent one day in Springerville and Eagar, visiting the various homes to stimulate their interest in the Fair, as well as to advise on what constitutes a good product for exhibit.

Because of the late completion of the Fair Buildings addition, little preliminary work could be done. Therefore, the making and receiving of entries did not go as smoothly as they might have. Many suggestions were offered for improvements in plans for the future.

The fact that the people in the County assume responsibility, but ask for and accept advice from the Agents, seems a healthy situation.

ORGANIZATION AND PLANNING: 4-H:

The three 4-H Clubs in Apache County showed the following completions:

The Agent attended the Achievement programs and assisted in judging the project work, which was of very high quality.

In all communities, the parents and friends of the Club members were in attendance, and showed a great deal of interest in advancing Club work as a community project.

Records were checked and pins and certificates were awarded to 4-H Club members and Leaders, according to the year's work.

CLOTHING AND TEXTILES: 4-H:

Both Springerville and Chambers Clubs made entries in the County Fair, and all blue-ribbon garments were then entered in the State Fair. Placings in the State Fair were high.
