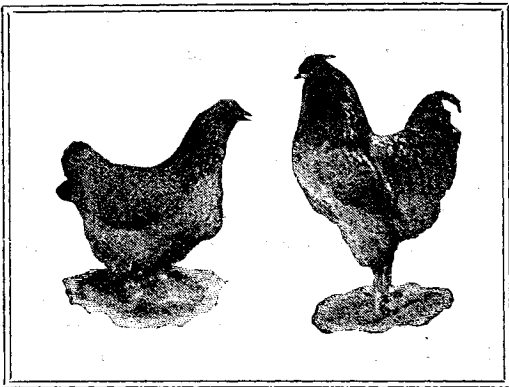

## SHOW RULES

### READ EACH RULE CAREFULLY AND MAKE SURE THEY ARE UNDERSTOOD

1—The latest revised edition of the American Standard of Perfection will be used to govern the judging. In general, the rules of this association, as set forth hereinafter, will be effective. Disputed matters and appeals, will be referred to the Show Advisory Committee and the decision of a majority of the members thereof shall be conclusive and final.

2—Entries will close December 24, 1925, and none will be accepted after that date.

3—**COMPETITION WILL BE OPEN TO THE WORLD.** But Maricopa County Exhibitors must be members of the Maricopa County Poultry Association, under which this show is being held.

4—The Exhibition will be held in Glendale, Arizona, on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, December 30, 1925, to January 2, 1926 inclusive. The show will be open daily from 9 a. m. to 6 p. m., and on Saturday night until 9 o'clock.

5—Where no express shipping value is stated on entry blanks, birds will be returned under an express shipping value of \$5.00 each.

6—All entries must be cooped on Tuesday, December 29th, before 6 p. m., as judging starts early December 30th, and no birds can be admitted on that date.

7—Should entries be made and birds not shown, the fees for same shall be forfeited to the Association.

8—The greatest possible care will be taken of all exhibits, but the Association will not be responsible for any loss by fire, death, theft or accident that might occur; competent men will be in charge of the display night and day, and the Association will do all in its power for the safety and comfort of the birds. But assumes no risk whatsoever.

9—To be eligible to compete for Sweepstakes Ribbon an exhibitor must enter and show, in each of the five regular classes, of the same variety, i. e., at least one cock, one hen, one cockerel, one pullet and one pen.

10—In counting points for Sweepstakes, and other special prizes of a like nature, first prize will count six points, second prize four points, third prize three points, fourth prize two points, fifth prize one point. Pens to count double, to be multiplied by the number of entries in that particular class or variety. The total points won by each exhibitor in all of the classes of the variety will determine the winner.

11—The Association will co-operate with any

exhibitor in the sale of birds, providing the sales price and leg band numbers are given on the Entry blank. Returns will be made as soon after the sale as possible.

12—Send all entries to W. F. Fetterly, 35 East Adams Street, Phoenix, Arizona. The official entry blanks must be used and entry fees must accompany the entry, when sent in.

13—Be sure to give leg band numbers when making entries—this is compulsory. Have your name and address on all shipping coops, to avoid mistakes.

14—Cocks, Hens and Old Pens are defined as birds hatched prior to 1925. Cockerels, Pullets and Young Pens, birds hatched during 1925. Birds shown as singles cannot compete in pens, nor can birds shown in pens compete in singles. It is not necessary to show an Old Pen to be eligible for Sweepstakes prize.

15—All exhibits will be under the sole control of the Superintendent, and shall not be removed until the close of the show, except by reason of illness. Birds purchased during the show must be governed by this rule. Poultry showing symptoms of disease or in unfit condition for exhibition will not be accepted upon arrival.

16—**SEND ALL EXHIBITS TO CHARLES H. GILBERT, SUPERINTENDENT OF THE POULTRY SHOW, GLENDALE, ARIZONA,** so as to reach him by 6 p. m. December 29, 1925.

17—There will be five prizes awarded in all classes, and ribbons given the winners. First prize, Blue Ribbon; second prize, Red Ribbon; third prize, Yellow Ribbon; fourth prize, Green Ribbon; fifth prize, White Ribbon.

18—Money prizes will be paid in all classes. In the ratio of 57% for First prize; 28% for Second prize, and 15% for Third prize. Pens to receive double that of single entries. The exact amount of the premium money cannot be determined until all other expenses are paid. But it is hoped that these prizes will run approximately \$2.00 for First, \$1.00 for Second, and 50 cents for Third on singles, and twice this amount on pens.

19—In all classes where there are less than three entries in a class, ribbons will be awarded, but first money will be with-held and second money paid to first, and third money to second prize winners. This is made necessary on account of a limited amount of capital which the Association has to operate on.

20—Read all rules carefully, and if they are not understood, consult the management and they will be explained gladly.

## ENTRY FEES

The entry fee for single birds will be 50 cents each; pens, consisting of one male and four females \$1.50 per pen.

Turkeys, Ducks, Geese, Guineas to be shown as singles only. Pigeons must be shown in pairs, either as old or young; fee, 50 cents per pair.

## CLUB SPECIALS

The Rhode Island Red Club of America, offers eight beautiful ribbons—four for the single comb variety and four for the rose comb variety. One for the best shaped male, one for the best shaped female, one for the best colored male and one for the best colored female in each variety. ## RECORD OF PERFORMANCE

**RECORD OF PERFORMANCE CLASSES** will be provided, and they will be governed by the Rules adopted at the Last Convention of the American Poultry Association, as follows, to-wit:—**FIRST**—All hens in this class to be banded or otherwise individually identified and be accompanied by an official certificate showing a year's production of 200 or more eggs laid, in a recognized egg laying contest or under official supervision, or by sworn affidavit of like production on home plant. **SECOND**—All males shown to be banded or otherwise individually identified and accompanied by sworn affidavit showing them to be offspring of dams or sires whose dams have produced 200 or more eggs in one year. **THIRD**—All fowls shown in these classes to be judged strictly by the American Standard of Perfection, latest edition, and subject to the same disqualifications as apply to the same breeds or varieties in open classes.

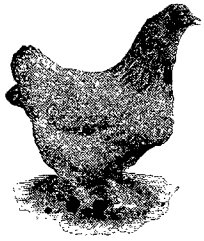

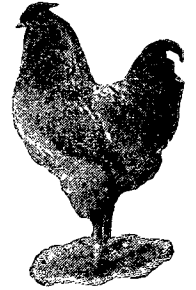
